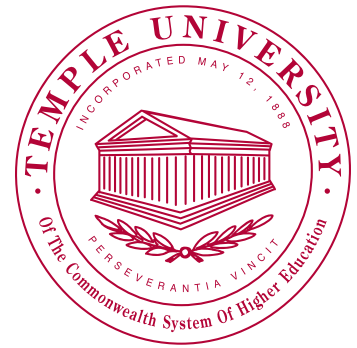

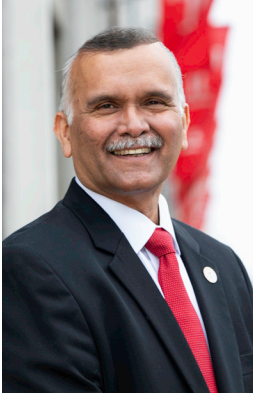

Temple University School Of Pharmacy

Temple University School of Pharmacy is one of the oldest pharmacy schools in the country and is part of a major educational and research institution. It is located on a comprehensive health sciences campus which includes the Schools of Pharmacy, Medicine, Dentistry and Health Professions.

Founded in 1901, seventeen years after Temple University's establishment, the School of Pharmacy has adhered to the University's mission of providing affordable and high quality education to those of modest means. It has maintained high standards throughout its history by providing outstanding education to those who wish to learn regardless of income.

It currently offers the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) as the entry-level degree to the profession, the MS and PhD in Pharmaceutical Sciences (Pharmaceutics, Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacodynamics), and the nation's premier Master of Science in Regulatory Affairs & Quality Assurance.

The School houses the Moulder Center for Drug Discovery research, The Jayne Haines Center for Pharmacogenomics and Drug Safety, a tissue culture facility for cell-based research, a Proteomics Facility an Addiction Research Lab and a CGMP facility, one of only six based at universities nationwide.
