

Dr. Craig Whitman is Assistant Dean of Academic Affairs at Temple University School of Pharmacy (TUSP). In this role, Dr. Whitman maintains oversight and leadership of the Doctor of Pharmacy curriculum and faculty affairs. He maintains a practice and experiential site in the Medical/Respiratory Intensive Care Unit at Temple University Hospital and teaches in several courses throughout the curriculum. Dr. Whitman previously served as the Interim Chair of the Department of Pharmacy Practice and the Associate Chair of the Department of Pharmacy Practice. Dr. Whitman has been at TUSP since 2014 and has prior experience as a clinical faculty member at Philadelphia College of Pharmacy in Philadelphia, PA and clinical pharmacist at Barnes-Jewish Hospital in St. Louis, MO. He developed and was Residency Program Director for the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy-Cooper University Hospital PGY2 Critical Care Residency program. Dr. Whitman received his Doctor of Pharmacy from Rutgers University and completed a PGY-1 Pharmacy Practice Residency at the VA Western New York Health System in Buffalo, NY, followed by a PGY-2 Critical Care Pharmacy Residency at the University at Buffalo School of Pharmacy. Dr. Whitman is a Board-Certified Critical Care Pharmacy Specialist and is recognized as a Fellow in Critical Care Medicine by the American College of Critical Care Medicine. He has authored several peer-reviewed publications, book chapters and poster presentations, and has delivered numerous invited professional presentations at local, regional, and international conferences. Dr. Whitman's research interests are centered on outcomes of critically ill patients related to drug therapy and pharmacy education. Dr. Whitman is an active member of the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy and the Society of Critical Care Medicine and past president of the Mid-Atlantic College of Clinical Pharmacy.
