

## **Clinical Neurology Academic Pharmacy Fellowship Philadelphia, Pennsylvania**

### **Description:**

The aim of this fellowship is to develop clinical and teaching expertise in individuals who seek to optimize medication outcomes in Neurological patients within a dynamic academic environment.

The fellow will be an integral part of the multidisciplinary team in the Neurology Department at Temple University Hospital and Neuroscience Ambulatory Clinics. The inpatient and outpatient clinics offer experiences in the management or treatment of stroke, epilepsy, multiple sclerosis, and migraine. In addition to clinical practice, the fellow will have the opportunity to develop a robust teaching portfolio with responsibilities to pharmacy students and neurology residents. The school of pharmacy and department of neurology in the school of medicine offer opportunities to contribute to didactic teaching and experiential preceptorship, respectively.

The fellow will also be expected to demonstrate proficiency in their research skills through design and implementation of an Investigational Review Board (IRB) research project.

- Doctor of Pharmacy degree from an ACPE accredited college of pharmacy
- Licensed pharmacist in Pennsylvania
- 1-year post-graduate training or 3+ years of clinical practice experience
- Board Certified Pharmacotherapy Specialist Certification preferred
