The Regulatory Affairs and Quality Assurance graduate program of Temple University School of Pharmacy is seeking candidates for a full-time (Dean's Appointment) teaching position at the rank of Associate Professor (Teaching). The position will be located at the Fort Washington Facility, in Fort Washington, PA, in the heart of the Delaware Valley's pharmaceutical industry. The successful candidate will have the minimum of a Master of Science in Regulatory Affairs or a related field, including extensive experience with current pharmacovigilance practices in the global pharmaceutical industry. Preference will be given to individuals who have a demonstrated track record of teaching graduate-level courses directly related to Global Pharmacovigilance Practices (such as Good Pharmacovigilance Operations, Clinical Drug Safety and Pharmacovigilance, Post Marketing Safety Surveillance, Legal and Regulatory Basis of Pharmacovigilance, Bioethics, and so forth). Ability to teach additional courses for the RAQA program is also desirable. Familiarity with remote learning techniques, including synchronous online learning and the use of Blackboard, is mandatory. Courses may be scheduled during weekdays, evenings, and weekends and may include delivery overseas. The successful candidate will be expected to have a commitment to professional and graduate education and be willing to mentor students in the RAQA graduate program as needed and also help with promoting the RAQA program through professional organizations as needed. Applicants should submit a cover letter indicating their area of interest and desired appointment rank, complete curriculum vitae, statement of industry experience, teaching philosophy, and contact information for three professional references.
