Temple University uses Zoom as the teaching platform, which is provided for free to all registered Temple students.

Required hardware

RAQA online courses are interactive, so you must have a webcam and microphone to participate. These are essential to provide an excellent online classroom experience for all students. Many laptops have built-in webcams and speakers. If you plan to use a device that does not, you are required to purchase them.

If you're a new student taking an online course, watch the <u>online course tutorial</u> and include the code at the end on your registration form. Next, schedule a short Zoom meeting with David Brickett (<u>dbrick@temple.edu</u>) or Jessie Chen (<u>jessie.chen@temple.edu</u>) to use our online technology. This ensures that everyone knows how to participate on Zoom during the first class meeting.

Proctorio is an online proctoring service that enables you to take exams at almost any location. If a course uses Proctorio, all students in the course must use that service.

Proctorio exams require a laptop or computer. Chrome notebooks, iPads, cell phones and other devices do not work. You must have **administrative access** to your laptop or computer, which means you can install software. Work computers may have built-in firewalls that prohibit software downloads. Please check this before registering.

Description: Leading in the pharmaceutical industry requires more than regulatory knowledge: it requires key skills to get the job done with various constituents, including coworkers, employees, and management. This course provides insights, rules, tools and requirements needed to lead in the highly regulated pharmaceutical industry. Students will study organizational principles and practices within the framework of the Code of Federal Regulations (specifically 21 CFR 210, 211, 312, 600 and 820). While these regulations provide what is required, they do not describe how to accomplish it. That task is the job of leadership. Using recommended texts, case studies, class lectures, discussions, and individual research, students will learn how to lead and manage in a regulated industry. Participants will gain the insights to support career goals with new understandings of the work and responsibilities that go along with the titles.
