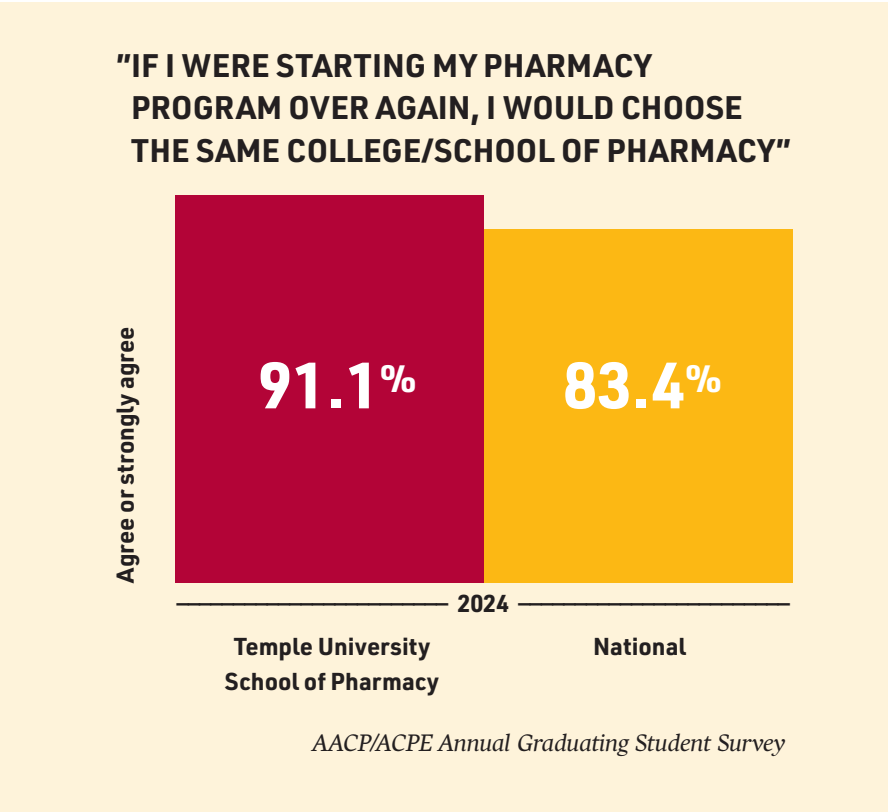
SUPPORT YOU CAN COUNT ON
